# Quick Allergy Card Your EpiPen® - Storage, Usage and Disposal

An EpiPen® (epinephrine) Auto-Injector, which must be prescribed by your physician, is used when you are having a severe allergic reaction or anaphylaxis. The EpiPen® automatically injects a pre-measured single dose of epinephrine. If possible, have more than one EpiPen® and make sure that those around you know where they are and how to use them.

## Where you store your EpiPen® is very important. Remember:

- Store at room temperature (59-86°F).
- Do not refrigerate.
- Keep in a dark area.
- Avoid high heat areas like trunks and glove compartments.

## Other important tips:

- Check the expiration date and make a note of it (example: Aug. 04=Aug. 31, 2004).
- Replace before the expiration date.
- · Check the fluid through the view window. It should be clear and colorless.

How to use the EpiPen® (Turn card over)

### Using the EpiPen®

Follow these directions only when ready to use:

- 1. Form a fist around the EpiPen®, with black tip pointing downward.
- With other hand, remove gray safety cap. DO NOT touch the black tip, as this is where the needle comes out.
- 3. At a 90° angle, quickly swing and jab EpiPen® firmly into outer thigh.
- 4. Hold firmly in thigh for 5 to 10 seconds.
- 5. Remove and massage injection area for a few seconds.
- 6. Check black tip: if needle is exposed, you received dose. If not, repeat steps #3-6.
- Call 911 or go to closest emergency room as effects of the EpiPen® will only last 15-20 minutes.

## Disposing of the EpiPen®

- Using a hard surface, bend needle back, place EpiPen® in yellow tube and give to a health care professional where you seek medical care.
- If unable to bend needle, place a penny in end of tube to prevent needle protrusion and give to a professional for proper disposal.
